Seven Flowers of Autumn (Aki-no Nanakusa / 秋の七草)



Hagi / 萩 (Bush Clover)

In Japan, there are Seven representative flowers of autumn (Aki-no Nanakuksa / 秋の七草) as opposed to the Seven Herbs in Spring (Haru-no Nanakusa / 春の七草) which are edible wild herbs of spring.

The Seven Flowers Autumn provide visual enjoyment. Their simplicity was very much admired: they are small and dainty yet beautifully colored. They are named as typical autumn flowers in a verse from the $Man'y\bar{o}sh\bar{u}$ (万葉集), the oldest existing anthology of Japanese poetry.





The basic philosophy of Satsuma

Jissinko Iroha-uta (日新公いろは歌) vol.21

Iroha-uta is originally a Japanese short poem. It is a perfect pangram, containing each character of the Japanese syllabary (hiragana) exactly once. Jissinko iroha-uta are 47 poems each of which begin, respectively, with the original iroha poems first

They also became the spirit of Goju kyoiku (郷中教育: The Satsuma education system).

The twenty-first poem (starting with the letter "な"):

名を今に残しおきける人も人 心も心何かおとらむ

(Na-wo Ima-ni Nokoshi Okikeru Hito-mo Hito

Kokoro-mo Kokoro Nani-ka Otoramu)

People who have left their name on the history are also human like us. They have the same minds and hearts like us, too. So, we are not inferior to them in anyway.

しもつき 霜月(Shimo-tsuki)

Japanese has a different name for each month. We call November "juichi-gatsu" usually, but we also have another name, "Shimotsuki".

It means "the month Frost ("Shimo" in Japanese) falls".

Shimotsuki Calendar

文化の日 (Bunka-no-hi)

November 3 (Thu)

It is a national holiday entitled "love freedom and peace, and promote advanced culture". It is the day the Japanese Constitution was promulgated, and peace and culture are respected in the constitution, so this day became Culture Day.

The Japanese Constitution was enforced May 3rd, in 1947. This day became Constitution Memorial Day.

立冬 (Rittou) November 8 (Tue)

The first day of winter by the old calendar.

It gets colder at night time and people feel the winter is coming. From this day to the day before the first day of Spring by the old calender (around 4th or 5th of February) is the winter.



小雪 (Shosetsu) November 23 (Wed)

The season in which the severe winter comes. But, there is not much snow yet, so it is called "Shosetsu (Little snow)". The sunshine gets weak and the air gets colder.

勤労感謝の日

(Kinro Kansha-no-hi)

November 23 (Wed)

Labor Thanksgiving Day.
It is a national holiday to "respect labor, celebrate productions and thank each other".

This day was enacted in 1948. They say that "Labor Thanksgiving Day" in Japan is "Thanks Giving Day" in America, but others say "Niname-sai (新嘗祭)" which was abolished after the war was changed to "Labor Thanksgiving Day". November 23 used to be "Niname-sai" before the war ended. "Niname-sai" is a harvest ceremony which the emperor holds.

* The dates above depend on the lunar calendar, so they change every year.



Have you ever seen Japanese children, dressed in kimono, visiting shrines in this season? It is an annual event which is called "Shichi-Go-San ($\pm \Xi \equiv$)".

Have you ever wondered why we have such an event? Here are the answers! You'll know all about "Shichi-Go-San" soon.

What is "七五三 (Shichi-go-san)"?

It is an event in which boys who are three and five, counting in the old Japanese way and girls who are three and seven go to shrines to give thanks for their healthy growth and pray for happiness and long lives. It is said to have originated in the Heian Period amongst court nobles who would celebrate the passage of their children into middle childhood. The ages three, five and seven are consistent with Japanese numerology, which dictates that odd numbers are lucky.

When do people go to shrines?

It used to be on the 15th of November in the old calender.

People used to say that the 15th is the day on which devils don't walk around, so they said that it is a good day for doing something.

Also the 15th is the full moon day. November is the month for thanking gods about the harvest, so people started to go to shrines to give thanks for the harvest and children's healthy growth at the same time. Now, it is not only for the 15th of November, but is more popular on Saturday and Sunday in November.

Why is it when the children are 3, 5 and 7 years old?

There were customs that children start to grow their hair (Kamioki / 髮置) when they become 3 years old, start to wear hakama; a long pleated skirt worn over a kimono (Hakamagi / 袴着) when they become 5 years old and at age 7 they start to wear real kimono instead of informal kimono for children (Obitoki / 帯解 or Himo-otoshi / 紐落). It is the same way to wear kimono as adults.

Until modern times, Japan was a poor country and many babies died, so this event, celebrating childrens' health was pertinent at that time.

What is Chitose-ame?

Chitose-ame (千歳飴) is a long stick of red or white candy sold at "Shichi-Go-San".

Parents hope for children's long lives, that's why the candy is long (about a diameter of 1.5cm and 1m long). White and red (actually the candy color is pink) are auspicious colors. The bag for the candies had pictures of a crane, a tortoise, pine trees, bamboos, Japanese apricot trees (*ume*) and other auspicious things. A candy peddler who was called Shichibe started to sell chitose-ame. Chitose means one thousand years old. This lucky name made this candy a big hit.





January Birthday:

When you feel stress, remember to breathe deeply. It calms you down and makes your mind clear.

February Birthday:

Listening to music is a lucky action for you this month. You might find a hint for solutions to your problems through music. Music also makes you happy and relax.

March Birthday:

You might have an opportunity to become a leader. Do not hesitate. You might have difficult time, but people trust you can do it. And at the end of this year you'll find you've leant so much and you've grown mentally.

April Birthday:

It could be a period in which you feel angry with many things, but be generous. If you show your generosity, it makes you lucky.

May Birthday:

It is the time to feel the stress. Get yourself back with 10 minutes meditation before you go to bed. You will be able to see what you should do.

June Birthday:

When your efforts don't bear fruit, resign it with good grace. Then you can see the new start line.

July Birthday:

Are you stressed because of a new environment? Relax is this month's key word. Fill the bath up, put in a few drops of aroma oil, and enjoy relaxing. You also need to try to get enough sleep.

August Birthday:

Be honest with yourself and other people. If you think it is right, tell others. Things go smoothly towards the direction which you hope. The important thing is honesty and truth.

September Birthday:

Make a note of what you did, what you felt or thought. Just a little note is OK. Through the note you'll realize some important things.

October Birthday:

Do good things for your spirit such as being grateful, being positive and doing things which make you happy.

November Birthday:

It is the time to have a halt and go back to basics. Check your life style. Keep regular hours, sleep enough and do some exercise.

December Birthday:

Your environment might change a lot this month. You might be worried or feel lonely. But, it is the month of movement for you and the month of preparation for the future. So accept the new environment and try to get used to it.
