

People decided who goes to the shrine by lots or by turns. Later, people built a shrine in the area and started to have a festival instead.



Where The City's Rubbish Ends Up

We throw away tons of things everyday. Where does the rubbish we throw away go? How is it disposed of? And why do we need to separate rubbish?

Let's find out the answers together!

Kagoshima city has 2 big waste incineration plants - Hokubu Seiso Kojo in Inuzako-cho and Nanbu Seiso Kojo in Taniyama. Burnable rubbish is burnt in these places. Non-burnabules go to Yokoi Umetate Shobunjo (the Yokoi Landfill Site), and recyclable things go to the Recycle Plaza next to Hokubu Seiso Kojo. Now, here are the answers to the questions on the top page.



ans including containers used to contain food or drink such as tuna cans, sweets cans and laver cans.

- •Please don't flatten cans or the wind machine can't separate aluminum cans from steel cans. Remove caps from bottles.
- •The plastic part inside the top isn't recycled because removing this part costs too much. So, the bottle top should be nonburnable.
- Empty contents and rinse before disposing.

Glass Bottles and Jars

including containers used to contain food or drink such as wine bottles, shochu bottles, bear bottles, jars which contained jam and pickles.

- •Please remove corks from bottles.
- •Empty contents and rinse before disposing.
- Place cans and bottles in one clear plastic bag together. Cans cushion glass bottles, so if they are in together glass bottles do not break easily.

Petbottles can also be recycled.

All pet(Poly Ethylene Terephthalate)bottles have the mark below. Before disposing, please check the mark.

- •Remove caps from petbottles. Plastic caps should be disposed of with plastic containers.
- •Empty contents and rinse before disposing.
- Place petbottles in their own bag.



Milk Cartons includes

juice containers (need to be the same shape as milk cartons, 500ml or more), but not lined with aluminium.

- •Cartons lined with aluminium are burnables.
- •Please wash, open, dry cartons then tie them with string. Don't combine with other garbage.



SPapers including pamphlets.

•Please don't place newspapers in paper bags or bind with tape, but bundle together and tie with string on their own.

- aper Boxes includes paper bags wrapping paper. • Waxed or oil lined cardboard should be disposed of as burnable rabbish.
- Any plastic from tissue boxes should be disposed of as burnable rubbish.
- •Metal serrated strips from plastic wrap / alminum foil boxes should be diposed of as non-burnables.
- •Please flatten boxes, bundle together and tie with string by type.

agazines can also be recycled.

- •Any leather or plastic covering on magazines should be disposed of as burnable rubbish.
- •Please bundle magazines together and tie with string by themselves.



Cardboard can also be

recycled. Cardboard has the section like the picture on the left.

•Flatten boxes, bundle together and tie with string.

Petbottles are recycled as many kinds of things.

Clothes, hats, gloves, shirts, umbrellas, carpets...They can be made with recycled petbottles. But, if they have stains or cigarette butts inside, they can't be recycled. Kagoshima city remove plastic labels from bottles, but if you can remove them it is one less thing for them to do and the recycle cost would be a little bit less. Other things are the same. Removing bottle caps, lables and plastic sheets are not difficult. Think about the earth and the future, do what we can do. It is not a big thing, but if everybody starts to try to recycle as much as we can, it might help the earth.

Shampoo bottles, plastic trays egg cartons, carrier bags and all containers displaying the plastic recycle symbol.

Plastic toys or plastic containers you buy at shops can't be recycled. Please dispose of them as burnable rubbish.

• Wash throughly to remove any oil or remaining food products.

•Dispose of clean containers only.

Used Clothes can also be

recycled.

They are collected once a month on the same day as papers. (Either Tuesday or Monday, depending on the area) Good conditioned clothes only.

•Place used clothes in their own bag.

Others: can't be recycled.

Manicure bottles and Paint cans are too dirty to be recycled, so please dispose of them as non-burnable rubbish.

Plastic toys are burnable rubbish.

rons are non-burnable rubbish.

Other home electronics are also nonburnable rubbish as long as they are small enough to put in a 45 litre rubbish bag.

The city doesn't collect TVs, air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, clothes dryers and personal computers with PC recycle mark. If you want to throw these away, please ask at the shop where you bought the item.

SPRAY CANS are collected once a month on the same day as papers. (Either Tuesday or Monday, depending on the area)

Furniture (shoe boxes, wardrobes, bookshelves, crockery cabinets, sofas, etc.), bedding (futon mattresses, beds, carpets), electrical appliances (Stereos, microwave ovens and others), bicycles, 50cc scooters, gas stoves, fuel heaters, laundry racks poles etc.

The basic philosophy of Satsuma

Jissinko Iroha-uta (日新公いろは歌) vol.24

Iroha-uta is originally a Japanese short poem. It is a perfect pangram, containing each character of the Japanese syllabary (hiragana) exactly once. Jissinko iroha-uta are 47 poems each of which begin, respectively, with the original iroha poems first syllabary.

They also became the spirit of Goju kyoiku (郷中教育: The Satsuma education system).

The twenty-second poem (starting with the letter " \mathfrak{I} "):

憂かりける今の身こそはさきの世と おもへばいまぞ後の世ならむ

(Ukarikeru Ima-no Mikoso-wa Saki-no Yo-to Omoeba Ima-zo Nochi-no Yo Naran)

When you think the miserable plight you are in may be punishment for sins you committed in a former existence, you want to live thinking that the life now coule be the result for the next life.



きさらぎ 如月(Kisaragi)

Japanese has a different name for each month. We call February, "Ni-gatsu" usually, but we also have another name "Kisaragi". About the meaning of "Kisaragi" there are several opinions. Some people say it is the month of regeneration of grass and trees and others say it is the season that people wear more clothes.

Kisaragi calendar

初午 (Hatsu-uma)

February 3 (Fri)

Hatsuuma is the first day of the Horse in February. It is the day of the Inari shrine festival. Inari shrine is where the god of the harvest is worshiped. You can see fox statues in front of Inari shrines. They say foxes are messengers of the gods of Inari shrines.

立春 (Risshun)

February 4 (Sat)

The start of the year and spring in the lunar calendar. People say from this day the weather gets warm.

針供養 (Hari Kuyo)

February 3 (Fri)

It is a custom in which people hold a memorial service for broken needles. In the *Kansai* area, this is held on the 8th of December.

In days past, needlework was indispensable for women, so appreciating the value of needles and holding a memorial service for them was an important event.

Now, this custom is held only by people who use them for their work. They stick needles in *tofu* or *konnyaku* and pray for improvement of sewing. Then the needles are offered at a household shrine altar. After that people purify the offering by floating it downriver to the sea, or taking it to a shrine.



建国記念の日 (Kenkoku kinen no hi)

February 11 (Sat)

According to "Nihon Shoki" the oldest Japanese book, Jinmu tenno became the first emperor on this day in 666 BC. It became a national holiday in 1967 as the day of "considering the foundation of the country and cultivating the mind for a patriotic spirit".

雨水 (Usui)

February 19 (Sun)

"Usui" means "the season the snow changes into rain and ice changes into water".

People start to prepare for farming

SETSUBUN (節分)

-The Day to Oust Evil Spirits from Your House-February 3rd (Fri)



What is Setsubun?

Setsubun is the day before the beginning of spring. Originally it meant the day before the beginning of spring, summer, autumn and winter. Now, it means only the day before the beginning of spring, which is the day of the start of the year in the lunar calendar.

What people do on this day?

On this day, people scatter parched soybeans, shouting "Oni-wa Soto, Fuku-wa Uchi" which means "Out with the devil! In with good fortune!" to get rid of evil spirits.

Usually the head of a family scatters the soybeans, but recently somebody in the family puts on the ogre mask and others throw the soybeans at the person. When you throw them, start with the innermost room and proceed to the front of the house.

After that people eat parched soybeans (eat the same number as your age), because it's said that if you eat them you can be healthy for the year.

What else do people eat?

Recently, people also eat a whole "Futo-maki / Eho-maki" (you shouldn't cut it) facing the good luck direction of the year, in silence. When you eat it, invoke your wish. (The good direction for 2012 is north-northwest.)

What do people decorate?

Depending on the area, people put a grilled sardine head and a holly branch at their front door as good-luck charms. They think devils run away because of the bad smell of grilled sarding and the holly thorns.



* The dates above depend on the lunar calendar, so they change every year.
